



# TRANSITIONAL PRESCRIPTION PROGRAM AND PHARMACY BENEFIT PLANS

EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2010

Coventry is pleased to announce a new transition pharmacy program that provides new members a transition service during the first 90 days of Coventry coverage. Under the program, new members may obtain a one-time fill or refill of certain covered prescription drugs --up to a 31-day supply-- at the applicable copayment, without being subject to the prior authorization, step therapy, and/or quantity limit requirements that normally apply to those drugs. Coventry will then send a letter to the member and prescribing provider, advising that the one-time fill or refill was made available under Coventry's transition program, and will include instructions on how to access Coventry alternatives for the drug in the future.

**How long is the transition period?** The transition period is 90 days. It begins on the member's effective date.

**Which drugs are eligible for transition?** Most commonly-used prior authorization, step therapy and once-daily quantity limit drugs are eligible under the transition program, as well

as some drugs normally excluded from coverage. **Specialty injectables and other quantity limits are excluded from the program.**

**How can a member find out which drugs are subject to the transition program?** To find out which drugs are subject to prior authorization, step therapy, quantity limits or other requirements, the member can call the Customer Service number on the back of their medical ID card or visit [www.cvty.com](http://www.cvty.com).

**How many transition drugs can a member get?** A member is entitled to one 31-day supply per drug during the 90-day transition period.

**How is the transition fill requested?** After a pharmacy claim is submitted, the pharmacist will receive a message saying that a transition fill may be available. The pharmacist can then trigger the transition fill by entering the code provided in the message into the pharmacy system. That

code allows the transition fill and generates the notification letter to the member.

**What should a member do to make sure they receive the transition fill?** If a member is entitled to a transition fill, they can assist their pharmacist by reminding him/her that they have new insurance and believe they are entitled to a one time transition fill.

**How will a member know they have received a transition drug?** The pharmacist should inform the member that a transition drug is being provided. The member will also receive a letter from Coventry advising that the recent refill was a transition drug and the member will need to take some action to get additional fills.

**What should a member do during the transition period?** Members should review the alternate drugs listed in the letter they receive from Coventry, and consult with their provider about prescribing one of the alternatives.
